# WHAT DO I DO?

Teaching can be one of the most rewarding professions. Helping prepare younger generations for their adult lives and careers can bring a high degree of fulfillment. As a paraeducator, you already have some experience in a classroom. You enjoy working with students. And you're already familiar with your school and its district. What if you're ready for more?

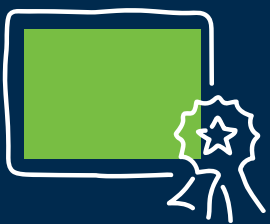
**Taking that next step to becoming a teacher isn't as difficult as you might think.**

- 1. Secure tuition funding.** For additional resources, consider a [Pell Grant](#), a state college grant, or scholarships.



- 2. Earn a bachelor's or master's degree.** All teaching jobs require at least a bachelor's degree. The amount of time you need to spend in a program depends on how much experience you have. If you already have an associate degree, you may be able to graduate with a bachelor's sooner. And if you earn your degree via a flexible online program, you might be able to graduate faster than at a traditional university.

- 3. Gain student teaching experience.** You'll need to accrue a certain number of hours of supervised teaching experience, which is included in a bachelor's or master's program.



- 4. Acquire a teaching certificate.** In addition to a bachelor's or master's degree, you'll need to become certified or licensed to teach in your state. You can get certified after completing a teacher preparation program.
